- 1. Children who are "looked after" (LAC) by a Local Authority (LA) within the meaning of Section 22(1) of the Children Act 1989 at the time of their application, and all "previously looked after" children (PLAC) including those who appear to have been in state care outside England (IAPLAC) and ceased to be in state care having been adopted.
- 2. Children who live in the designated area and have a brother or sister on roll at the time of application who will still be attending at the time of entry.
- 3. Children who live in the designated area
- 4. Children who have a brother or sister on roll at the time of application who will still be attending at the time of entry but live outside the designated area.
- 5. All other children who do not live in the designated area and also do not have a brother or sister on roll at the time of application who will still be attending at the time of entry.
